

DRESS CODE & UNIFORMS

All students are strongly encouraged to wear school uniforms which consist of a white, yellow, or royal/navy blue shirt and blue or black shorts, pants, skirts, jumpers, or skorts. They are also expected to exercise habits of good personal hygiene. Students are expected to dress in good taste and may be advised from time to time by the principal and/or faculty regarding acceptable dress.

Generally, students are not to dress in clothing which compromises safety or modesty or causes a disruption to the educational process.

STUDENTS MAY NOT WEAR THE FOLLOWING:

1. Any clothing/apparel/jewelry/ which:
 - a. Is considered unsafe, dangerous, or a health hazard.
 - b. Contains offensive or obscene symbols, signs, slogans, words degrading any gender, cultural, religious, or ethnic values.
2. Any attire of grooming which is disruptive to the instructional process which may include but not limited to:
 - a. sheer/see-through blouses, shirts and/or skirts;
 - b. bare midriffs/halter tops;
 - c. short shorts or skirts (shorts and skirts are to be knee-length);
 - d. tight or revealing clothing (including leggings);
 - e. pants with words that extend across the backside;
 - f. clothing which allows underwear to be exposed;
 - g. baggy pants without a belt;
 - h. extremes in hair styles, colors;
 - i. sun glasses;
 - j. biker's shorts
 - k. thong-type sandals, flip flops, plastic shoes (jellies); and
 - l. Overalls with only one or no straps buckled.
3. Hats, headbands, wristbands, and wave caps may not be worn in the building.
4. ***ALL SHIRTS MUST BE TUCKED IN, AND PANTS MUST BE PULLED UP TO THE WAIST AND SECURED WITH A BELT.***

Local schools are granted the authority to establish school-based dress and grooming standards. The Principal will work with teachers, students, and parents in the establishment of any such local standards.
